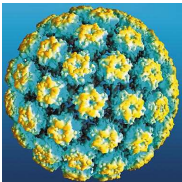
As well as being taught by an experienced facilitator clinical experts deliver some of the inputs on this course, ensuring students are furnished with relevant, up-to-date information. A visit to a Cytology Lab also takes place during the course.

Assessment

To successfully complete the course, the student will be expected to:

1. Submit written evidence of having completed the practical requirements of the course, which include 2 observed, 5 supervised and 20 unsupervised, cytologically adequate smears and the same number of breast awareness sessions.
2. Submit written evidence of visits to a Breast Screening Unit, Colposcopy clinic and Cytology Laboratory
3. Submit one written assignment (3,000 words)
4. Attend all study days

The visit to the Cytology Lab takes place during the course but it is the **responsibility of the student** to arrange the Colposcopy visit.



Please note:

A clinical mentor must be identified prior to commencing the course. The course is open to all qualified nurses. Places are limited to 15 students per course.
