1a: How many physical servers does the organisation manage? (please specify numbers on site, Offsite)? 67 physical servers on-site.

1b:Which vendor(s) does the organisation use? Cisco and HP.

1c:How much did the organisation spend on purchasing server hardware in the past 2 years? Circa £187K.

1d: Who is responsible for purchasing new server equipment, technically and commercially? CIS & Infrastructure Services Manager.

1e: Who do you make your server purchases though? Through the National Server & Storage Agreement (NSSA) Framework.
