ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Applicants must meet the undernoted criteria set out by the Trustees.

- Awards may be made to students having their ordinary residence in Scotland and studying anywhere
 in the world (including Scotland) or students having their ordinary residence outside Scotland and
 studying in Scotland.
- Awards may be made to undergraduates who have completed at least one year of study, postgraduates undertaking taught courses or postgraduates engaged in research for a higher degree.
- Trustees will not favour applications to cover expenditure which should have been planned at the
 outset of the course such as required periods abroad or required field courses. They are more likely
 to favour applications to cover expenditure arising from unforeseen contingencies and unexpected
 circumstances, or to meet the costs of specific material needs.
- Applications must be signed by the applicant in 2 places as indicated on the application form

Applicants must also be willing to meet the award conditions set out in the 'Award Conditions' section below.

UNIVERSITY GUIDANCE NOTES - FAQ

Q: What year or level of study do I enter on the application?

A: Please enter the year of study you will be commencing in the 2019/20 academic year.

Q: I am in year 1, do I qualify to make an application?

A: Yes, at the time that award payments are made you will have completed the first year of your course (provided you progress).

Q: I have a conditional offer, will my application be considered?

A: Unfortunately we will only be able to consider applications from applicants who hold an unconditional offer at the time of the short list decision making panel.

Q: How should I present my academic record?

A: You may attach a copy of your academic record from OASIS or your HEAR record (contact SEZ for advice)

Q: Who should I get to be my referee?

A: We would encourage you to seek an Academic Referee to support your application and to obtain a written reference to enhance your application. Please refer to the 'Making a Strong Application' guidance via the link below for more information on referencesand referees.

WHAT KIND OF FUNDING IS AVAILABLE?

Bursaries will, in general, range from £500 to £3,000.

Awards will be paid in up to 2 instalments with the first payment being no earlier than 31st October 2019.

Students may request that the all or part of the award be paid directly to the University Finance office towards the costs of tuition fees or University accommodation.

AWARD CONDITIONS

Applicants must be willing and able to meet the following award conditions if successful:

- 1. To write a Thank You letter addressed to the Award Donor
- 2. To give permission for elements of your Thank You letter to be quoted for promotional materials
- 3. To take part in promotional activity relating to this Award
- 4. To provide receipts related to your award related costs if requested

APPLICATION DEADLINES

Applications must be submitted by the deadline with all applicable evidence as outlines within the application form. Incomplete applications will not be considered.

Deadline: Monday 3rd June 2019

HOW CAN I APPLY?

Applications may be downloaded and completed on a device or printed and completed by hand. A typed signature may be accepted where the application has been completed electronically.

Applications must be submitted with the supporting evidence detailed in the application form.

APPLICATION SUBMISSION

Completed applications and evidence should be submitted to the Advisory Service in one of the following ways:

By Email (preferred method)

Please chose relevant document titles and save documents in PDF format before attaching to your email. You will receive an automated response to confirm your email has been received. Please take this as confirmation of receipt.

In Person

Applications may be submitted in person at the SEZ Reception Desk or during a Funding Drop in session. Please allow time for your application to be checked by the member of staff receiving it.

By Post

Ideally applications should be submitted in person or by email however we can accept applications by post to the address below. Please be aware that there may be a delay in your application being received even if being sent by first class post.

APPLICATION QUERIES AND ASSISTANCE
