The University's Response

Could you let me have information you hold regarding the number of undergraduate students with 'RUK fee status' who first matriculated in each of the academic years 2012-13, 2013-14 and 2014-2015. In the case of 2014-15 I appreciate that the information requested may be provisional and should therefore relate to as at the latest date that you hold it for. I am interested in the number matriculating as undergraduates for the first time in each year – i.e. entrant students.

2012/13	101
2013/14	80
2014/15	78

Could you also provide me with information you hold summarising the University's total expenditure on scholarships, bursaries or other awards to students with 'RUK fee status' in the academic years 2012-13 and 2013-14.

2012-13: £36,000
2013-14: £75,000
